Highlights for July and August 2024:

JULY 2024


- Meeting with USFS regarding IFPD USFS Partnership agreement.
- IFPD Team 11 members responded to the BASIN fire on the Sequoia NF: June 27-July 14th.
- IFPD participated in the annual Idyllwild 4th of July "Independence Day Parade" (Six IFPD Vehicles) IFPD also participated in the events throughout the day and the Concert that evening.
- IFPD Participated in the first annual JULY 5th celebration. (July tree lighting) IFPD provided coloring books and fire safety information to the kids, fire prevention and safety info to adults too.
- → IFPD Participated in the ongoing summer concert series and provided the US Flag on T621.
- IFPD Sent a T6 strike team to the White Fire which then was reassigned to the Ridge Fire in Kern County Ca. July 16-24th
- IFPD Team 11 members responded to the SQF Lightning Fires and then the Borel Fire in the Sequoia NF. July 26th Aug 10th.
- IFPD Provided ambulance/EMS coverage and service to the Friday night football games at Hamilton High School in Anza Ca.
- IFPD Sent a T3 Strike team to the GOLD fire in the Plumas NF and was then reassigned to the Park fire. July 25th Aug Aug 11th.

August 2024 -

- IFPD Team 11 members worked the Borel fire until August 10th 2024.
- IFPD ST6074C worked the Park fire until August 11th.
- FIFPD Team 11 members responded to the Boise Fire in the Six Rivers and Klamath NF's from August 22nd through September 8th.
- IFPD Participated in the annual "National Night Out with RivCo Sherriffs department.
- IFPD Provided ambulance/EMS coverage and service to the Friday night football games at Hamilton High School in Anza Ca.
- IFPD underwent FF Oral Board Interviews with test Candidates.
- IFPD Participated in the ongoing summer concert series and provided the US Flag on T621.

2023 Property Abatement Results:

The Idyllwild Fire Protection District inspects 3829 properties each year.



- As Per IFPD Ord. 19-01 we have begun performing our annual abatement inspections on ALL properties within IFPD jurisdiction. IFPD crews completed the first round of inspections on **April 30th** and failed inspection notices were mailed out to 623 property owners (Last year we mailed out over 705 fails on the first round of inspections.
- > Second inspections will begin May 15th, After the second inspection notices are mailed out, then a three week interval is given to complete the work prior to the final inspections being performed.
- ➤ We anticipate final inspections in June. Last year **81** citations were mailed out on those properties which remained out of compliance.
- > Overall 2023 abatement results: <u>97% compliance</u> and <u>3% noncompliance</u>. We continue to work with those who have not come into compliance to

Ongoing Property Abatement 2024:

As with previous years the Idyllwild Fire Protection District will continue inspecting ALL (3829) properties for compliance with ORD 19-01. This local ordinance is in addition to the CA State abatement regulations: (IFPD abatement Inspections begin late spring generally Mid to Late April – Early May each year). *This year's 1st inspections have been conducted with 623 1st inspection fail notices being mailed out.* IFPD has reinspected the **623** parcels with final fail notices being mailed out to **248** property owners. *Citation notices*



have been mailed out to any property owner not found in compliance.

ensure all have met / will meet the minimum abatement requirements.

Items which top the "Failed" inspection list each year are:

- Address Numbers These must be 4" or greater in size and must be visible from the street in a contrasting color.
- Clearance around Propane Tanks Must have a minimum of 10' clearance around LP tanks.
- Roof clear of flammable debris Your roof must be free from pine needles, leaves, and other flammable debris.
- Thirty (30') ft. clearance of all vegetation around your home.



Ongoing Fuels Projects: The Idyllwild Fire Protection District continues to work with our Cooperative Partners on fuels reduction and community resiliency projects: Thomas Mountain, Westridge, South Ridge, Strawberry, and other local fuels projects. The IFPD has also had the opportunity to assist with fuels projects in the Cleveland National Forest.

<u>Update: (Partnership agreement with the USFS is completed)</u>

Bear Trap Fuel Reductions:

IFPD continues working on this critical fuel reduction project with the private property owners to reduce fuels on a ridgeline west of Idyllwild and east of Bear Trap Canyon. These fuels reductions will greatly strengthen our fire prevention efforts along with the other ongoing fuels reductions projects on west ridge, south ridge, and strawberry fuel reductions. We anticipate an RX treatment in early 2024 on this project.



<u>Update: The Bear Trap fuel project is ready for an RX (firing) treatment. We will likely need to di a "re-entry" on this project early 2025 and then apply the Rx treatment.</u>

Communications Site:

The IFPD completed improvements to our communications site. The IFPD plans to relocate WNKI (1610 am emergency radio) to the site which will greatly enhance our overall emergency communications network and provide a larger coverage area for the community. This relocation is anticipated to take place early 2024. Thank you to all those who participated in making this project a huge success! (We are currently working with SCE on providing permanent power to this site) Currently we have LP generator power and solar energy providing power to the site.

<u>Update: We have worked through the project planning process with SCE and anticipate</u> having final "site plan" approvals soon, this will provide for permanent power to the site.

Individual and ongoing Community CPR Classes:

IFPD delivers several CPR classes each year. In 2023 we provided five (5) CPR classes for the USFS, two (2) local tree company classes, two (2) local camp



employees courses and two (2) community CPR classes. *We have already provided six (6) CPR class in 2024*, one for the local water districts one for MCFSC, one for Tree Companies, one for the local medical clinic, one for local camps and a



community "citizen" CPR class. (Persons interested in attending a CPR class should contact our office and speak with Rachel for details and schedule)

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)

IFPD held a full CERT Course in October of 2023. We also conducted 1 refresher course in June of 2023. IFPD sponsors MDP (Mountain Disaster Preparedness) and partners with them in the training of new CERT members. Twenty-two new CERT members took the October 2023 training course.



The IFPD anticipates putting on one (1) new CERT course and one (1) refresher course in 2024.

IFPD CREW621:

Members of Crew 621 received an "in Service" training on May 19th 2024

Crew 621 has a greater than 80% return of last year's members which will allow crew 621 to reclassify as a type II IA crew (upgrading from last year's classification of Type II) All members have received a full in service "red card" training and the crew is in service and has already been assisting the USFS (BDF) San Jacinto Ranger District with the continued prescribed burn project at Thomas Mountain, and has also provided Mutual Aid to the Sierra National Forest from June 29th through July 12th 2024. Great Job CREW 621!!!



UPDATE: As I write this report Crew 621 is providing critical fire suppression services on the "LINE FIRE" in the San Bernardino National Forest. Thanks Crew 621 for your incredible effort, and reliable service, we know that those who have received the benefit of your hard work and effort truly appreciate you!!.

Training:

All IFPD members continue to complete and exceed all minimum fire training requirements. 30 hours of minimum training per month for all career staff members and, 20 hours of continuous training for all reserve/intern and crew members. Annual EMS education (continuing education was completed in January and February of 2024 for all IFPD employees/admin staff and intern reserves). All IFPD suppression personnel have completed the annual "red card" training.

IFPD was extremely busy throughout the 2023/24FY, and continue to be busy in the early months of the 24/25 FY. In addition to our regular call volume and automatic - mutual aid services that we provide, the IFPD also:

- hosts several school visits and fieldtrip to the Fire Station, Participates in Fire Prevention Month by visiting the Idyllwild School and educating our Kids on Fire Safety, visiting the Idyllwild Library for "Storytime" reading with the Kids, Visiting Awana at the Idyllwild Bible Church for fire prevention week, we had a Great visit with Senator Kelly Seyarto to discuss fire safe communities. We consistently Participate in the annual Fourth of July Parade, the Idyllwild Halloween Parade and Carnival and the Annual Idyllwild Christmas Tree Lighting. We met with Congressman Ken Calvert and his staff, we have had the opportunity to speak with numerous local membership groups (Rotary, Idy Elders, Water Districts) IFPD assisted the USFS with their "C" FAL1 certification program, and also put on our own "C" Faller1 certification class this year.

Chief LaMont noted that the Thomas Mountain burn along with the Bear Trap fuel break have been put on hold due to the early start of the 2024 fire season and that they will get started on these projects next year. The firefighter's test has been started and we will are going into oral interviews once the interview pannel is complete we will undergo Chief interviews and move on to selections. Once the FF selection has been made we will begin our Battalion Chief testing process and anticipate those appointments by year end 2024. Early in 2025 we will have a Fire Captains testing process as we anticipate promotions for the 25/26 FY. Last year we had a 97% compliant rate for property abatement. This year our compliance percentage went down a little bit with a 93% compliance rate. Thank you to Steve and Tonya and the volunteers for their help with the address signs, going door to door helping residents work through new signs and helping to ensure that signs are visable. The communications site is up and running, we anticipate moving WNKI to that location by year end 2024 which will provide better overall coverage for the emergency radio system (1610am) and our local frequency coverage as well. SCE is currently working on permanent power for the site, currently we have solar with battery back and propane generator power but we are working to ensure we have multipule redundancy for power at our site. We have already been on many Mutual Aid assignments this year and

anticipate this trend will continue throughout the 2024 fire season. Lots of rain last wainter equals lots of fine

flashy grass fuel which ultimatly carries fire rapidly across the landscape.

VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TERMS AND CONDITIONS

DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE PROTECTION

STATE OF CALIFORNIA Natural Resources Agency

Agreement for the Volunteer Fire Assistance Program of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered between the	STATE of California, acting through th
Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Prote	ection hereinafter called "STATE", and
Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Prote	District hereinafter called
"LOCAL AGENCY", covenants as follows:	

RECITALS:

- 1. STATE has been approved as a passthrough agent of the United States Department of Agriculture, (USDA), Forest Service for the purpose of administering the Volunteer Fire Assistance program in California, hereinafter referred to as VFA, authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistant Act of 1978 (PL 95-313, 92 Stat, 365, 16 U.S.C. 2106 as amended).
- 2. This is a subaward under the 2024 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant #24-DG-11052012-171 awarded to STATE by the Forest Service on August 23, 2024. The Federal Assistance Listing for the award is 10.698. Cooperative Fire Program. This subaward is funded solely with Federal funds and is subject to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance in subparts A through F of 2 CFR Part 200, as adopted and supplemented by the USDA in 2 CFR Part 400, and under certain terms and conditions to LOCAL AGENCY to assist LOCAL AGENCY to upgrade its fire protection capability.
- LOCAL AGENCY desires to participate in said VFA and agrees to the terms and conditions specified in the Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Assistance Program 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

- 4. <u>APPROVAL</u>: This Agreement is of no force or effect until signed by both parties and approved by the Department of General Services, if required. LOCAL AGENCY may not commence performance until such approval has been obtained.
- 5. INCORPORATION: The Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Assistance Program 2024, submitted Application for Funding and associated Grant Assurances are hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Grant Agreement.
- 6. <u>TIMELINESS</u>: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 7. FORFEITURE OF AWARD: LOCAL AGENCY must return this Agreement and required resolution properly signed and executed to STATE at the email address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than December 1, 2024 or LOCAL AGENCY will forfeit the funds.

8. GRANT AND BUDGET CONTIGENCY CLAUSE: It is mutually understood between the parties that this **Agreement** may have been written for the mutual benefit of both parties before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, to avoid program and fiscal delays that would occur if the **Agreement** were executed after that determination was made.

This **Agreement** is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the STATE by the United States Government for the **State Fiscal Year 2024** for the purpose of this program. In addition, this **Agreement** is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, or conditions enacted by the Congress or to any statute enacted by the Congress that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this **Agreement** in any manner.

The parties mutually agree that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this **Agreement** shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The STATE has the option to invalidate the **Agreement** under the 30-day cancellation clause or to amend the **Agreement** to reflect any reduction in funds.

- 9. REIMBURSEMENT: STATE will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY, from funds made available to STATE by the Federal Government, an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 on a 50/50 matching funds basis, for the performance of specific projects and/or purchase of specific items identified in Proposed Project, Application for Funding, attached hereto. Reimbursement will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and JUNE 30, 2025. This sum is the sole and maximum payment that STATE will make pursuant to this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY must bill STATE at the e-mail address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than September 1, 2025 in order to receive the funds. The bill submitted by LOCAL AGENCY must clearly delineate the projects performed and/or items purchased. A vendor's invoice and proof of payment to vendor(s) must be included for items purchased.
- 10. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>: Expenditure of the funds distributed by STATE herein is subject to the same limitations as placed by the VFA, upon expenditure of United States Government Funds. Pursuant to 2CFR200.313 Equipment, subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in that section; title to any equipment and supplies acquired under this **Agreement** vests with the LOCAL AGENCY. For any equipment items over \$5,000, the federal government may retain a vested interested in accordance with paragraph 17 below.
- 11. MATCHING FUNDS: Any and all funds paid to LOCAL AGENCY under the terms of this **Agreement**, hereinafter referred to as "VFA Funds", shall be matched by LOCAL AGENCY on a dollar-for-dollar basis, for each project listed on attachment(s) hereto identified as "Proposed Project". No amount of unpaid "contributed" or "volunteer" labor or services shall be used or consigned in calculating the matching amount "actually spent" by LOCAL AGENCY.

LOCAL AGENCY shall not use VFA Funds as matching funds for other federal grants, including Department of Interior (USDI) Rural Fire Assistance grants, nor use funds from other federal grants, including USDI Rural Fire Assistance grants, as matching funds for VFA Funds.

- 13. PURPOSE: Any project to be funded hereunder must be intended to specifically assist LOCAL AGENCY to organize, train, and/or equip local firefighting forces in the aforementioned rural area and community to prevent or suppress fires which threaten life, resources, and/or improvements within the area of operation of LOCAL AGENCY. Project funds are not to be used for research and development.
- 14. <u>COMBINING</u>: In the event funds are paid for two or more separate, but closely related projects, the 50/50 cost-sharing formula will be applied to the total cost of such combined projects.
- 15. OVERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project exceeds the estimate of costs upon which this Agreement is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request additional funds to cover the **Agreement** share of the amount exceeded. However, there is no assurance that any such funds are, or may be, available for reimbursement. Any increase in funding will require an amendment.
- UNDERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project is less than the estimate of costs upon which this **Agreement** is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request that additional eligible projects/items be approved by STATE for **Agreement** funding. However, there is no assurance that any such approval will be funded. Approval of additional projects/items, not listed on the Proposed Project application, made by STATE, will be in writing and will require an amendment.
- 17. FEDERAL INTEREST IN EQUIPMENT: The Federal Government has a vested interest in any item purchased with VFA funding in excess of \$5,000 regardless of the length of this **Agreement**, until such time as the fair market value is less than \$5,000. The VFA percentage used to purchase the equipment will be applied to the sale price and recovered for the Government during the sale. This percentage will remain the same even following depreciation. The Federal Government may not have to be reimbursed if the disposal sale amounts to a fair market value of less than \$5,000. LOCAL AGENCY will notify STATE of the disposal of such items.

18. EQUIPMENT INVENTORY: Any single item purchased in excess of \$5,000 will be assigned an VFA Property Number by the STATE. LOCAL AGENCY shall forward a copy of the purchase documents listing the item, brand, model, serial number, any LOCAL AGENCY property number assigned, and a LOCAL AGENCY contact and return address to STATE at the address specified in paragraph 12. The STATE will advise the LOCAL AGENCY Contact of the VFA Property Number assigned.

- AUDIT: LOCAL AGENCY agrees that the STATE, the Department of General Services, the Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this **Agreement**. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of five (5) years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, LOCAL AGENCY agrees to include a similar right of the State of California to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this **Agreement**. (GC 8546.7, PCC 10115 et seq., CCR Title 2, Section 1896).
- 20. <u>DISPUTES</u>: In the event of any dispute over qualifying matching expenditures of LOCAL AGENCY or audit findings, the dispute will be decided by STATE and its decision shall be final and binding.
- MONITORING: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to the monitoring of activities as necessary by STATE to ensure that the award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the agreement; and that performance goals are achieved.
- 22. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless, the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims and losses, accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this **Agreement**, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by LOCAL AGENCY in the performance of this **Agreement**.
- 23. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to comply with civil rights requirements as detailed in the Complying With Civil Rights Requirements brochure (FS-850) and the And Justice For All poster (AD-475A). The poster is to be placed at all public point of contact/reception areas.
- 24. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:
 - a. Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
 - b. Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:

- 1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
- 2) the person's or organization's policy of maintaining a drugfree workplace;
- any available counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and,
- 4) penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
- c. Every employee who works on the proposed Agreement will:
 - 1) receive a copy of the company's drug-free workplace policy statement; and,
 - 2) agree to abide by the terms of the company's statement as a condition of employment on the **Agreement**.

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in suspension of payments under the **Agreement** or termination of the **Agreement** or both and LOCAL AGENCY may be ineligible for funding of any future State **Agreement** if the department determines that any of the following has occurred: (1) the LOCAL AGENCY has made false certification, or violated the certification by failing to carry out the requirements as noted above. (GC 8350 et seq.)

- 25. <u>TERM</u>: The term of the Agreement SHALL COMMENCE ON THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and continue through June 30, 2025.
- 26. <u>TERMINATION</u>: This **Agreement** may be terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice to the other party or provisions herein amended upon mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- 27. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: No amendment or variation of the terms of this **Agreement** shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or **Agreement** not incorporated in the **Agreement** is binding on any of the parties.
- 28. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>: LOCAL AGENCY, and the agents and employees of LOCAL AGENCY, in the performance of this **Agreement**, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the STATE or the Federal Government.
- 29. <u>INDIRECT RATE</u>: LOCAL AGENCY may not assess an indirect rate in excess of their Federally approved Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA), a de minimis rate if LOCAL AGENCY does not have an approved NICRA, or the VFA program cap rate of 10%, whichever is lesser. LOCAL AGENCY may also elect not to assess an indirect rate. The approved indirect cost rate at the time of execution is 0%.

- 30. <u>MEDIA</u>: LOCAL AGENCY shall acknowledge STATE and USDA Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals and electronic media developed as a result of this award.
 - It is encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this award and announce progress and accomplishments, acknowledging STATE and USDA Forest Service support. Follow direction in USDA Supplemental 2 CFR 415.2.
- 31. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: This Agreement is not assignable by LOCAL AGENCY either in whole or in part.

Agreement for the Volunteer Fire Capacity Program of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered between the STATE of California, acting through the
Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection hereinafter called "STATE", and
Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection hereinafter called "STATE", and Lawrence Tree Company hereinafter called
"LOCAL AGENCY", covenants as follows:

RECITALS:

- STATE has been approved as a passthrough agent of the United States Department of Agriculture. (USDA), Forest Service for the purpose of administering the Volunteer Fire Capacity program in California, hereinafter referred to as VFC, authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act (CFAA) of 1978 (PL 95-313, 92 Stat 365, 16 U.S.C. 2106), as amended.
- 2. This is a subaward under the 2024 Volunteer Fire Capacity Grant #24-DG-11052012-161 awarded to STATE by the Forest Service on August 23, 2024. The Federal Assistance Listing for the award is 10.698. Cooperative Forestry Program. This subaward is funded solely with Federal funds and is subject to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance in subparts A through F of 2 CFR Part 200, as adopted and supplemented by the USDA in 2 CFR Part 400, and under certain terms and conditions to LOCAL AGENCY to assist LOCAL AGENCY to upgrade its fire protection capability.
- 3. LOCAL AGENCY desires to participate in said VFC and agrees to the terms and conditions specified in the Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Capacity Program 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

- 4. <u>APPROVAL</u>: This Agreement is of no force or effect until signed by both parties and approved by the Department of General Services, if required. LOCAL AGENCY may not commence performance until such approval has been obtained.
- 5. <u>INCORPORATION</u>: The Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Capacity Program 2024, submitted Application for Funding and associated Grant Assurances are hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Grant Agreement.
- 6. <u>TIMELINESS</u>: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- FORFEITURE OF AWARD: LOCAL AGENCY must return this Agreement and required resolution properly signed and executed to STATE at the email address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than December 1, 2024 or LOCAL AGENCY will forfeit the funds.

8. GRANT AND BUDGET CONTIGENCY CLAUSE: It is mutually understood between the parties that this **Agreement** may have been written for the mutual benefit of both parties before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, to avoid program and fiscal delays that would occur if the **Agreement** were executed after that determination was made.

This **Agreement** is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the STATE by the United States Government for the **State Fiscal Year 2024** for the purpose of this program. In addition, this **Agreement** is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, or conditions enacted by the Congress or to any statute enacted by the Congress that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this **Agreement** in any manner.

The parties mutually agree that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this **Agreement** shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The STATE has the option to invalidate the **Agreement** under the 30-day cancellation clause or to amend the **Agreement** to reflect any reduction in funds.

- 9. REIMBURSEMENT: STATE will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY, from funds made available to STATE by the Federal Government, an amount not to exceed \$10,050.00 on a 50/50 matching funds basis, for the performance of specific projects and/or purchase of specific items identified in Proposed Project, Application for Funding, attached hereto. Reimbursement will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and JUNE 30, 2025. This sum is the sole and maximum payment that STATE will make pursuant to this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY must bill STATE at the e-mail address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than September 1, 2025 in order to receive the funds. The bill submitted by LOCAL AGENCY must clearly delineate the projects performed and/or items purchased. A vendor's invoice and proof of payment to vendor(s) must be included for items purchased.
- 10. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>: Expenditure of the funds distributed by STATE herein is subject to the same limitations as placed by the VFC, upon expenditure of United States Government Funds. Pursuant to 2CFR200.313 Equipment, subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in that section; title to any equipment and supplies acquired under this **Agreement** vests with the LOCAL AGENCY. For any equipment items over \$5,000, the federal government may retain a vested interested in accordance with paragraph 17 below.
- 11. MATCHING FUNDS: Any and all funds paid to LOCAL AGENCY under the terms of this **Agreement**, hereinafter referred to as "VFC Funds", shall be matched by LOCAL AGENCY on a dollar-for-dollar basis, for each project listed on attachment(s) hereto identified as "Proposed Project". No amount of unpaid "contributed" or "volunteer" labor or services shall be used or consigned in calculating the matching amount "actually spent" by LOCAL AGENCY.

LOCAL AGENCY shall not use VFC Funds as matching funds for other federal grants, including Department of Interior (USDI) Rural Fire Assistance grants, nor use funds from other federal grants, including USDI Rural Fire Assistance grants, as matching funds for VFC Funds.

PURPOSE: Any project to be funded hereunder must be intended to specifically assist LOCAL AGENCY to organize, train, and/or equip local firefighting forces in the aforementioned rural area and community to prevent or suppress fires which threaten life, resources, and/or improvements within the area of operation of LOCAL AGENCY. Project funds are not to be used for research and development.
- 14. <u>COMBINING</u>: In the event funds are paid for two or more separate, but closely related projects, the 50/50 cost-sharing formula will be applied to the total cost of such combined projects.
- 15. OVERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project exceeds the estimate of costs upon which this Agreement is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request additional funds to cover the **Agreement** share of the amount exceeded. However, there is no assurance that any such funds are, or may be, available for reimbursement. Any increase in funding will require an amendment.
- 16. <u>UNDERRUNS</u>: In the event that the total cost of a funded project is less than the estimate of costs upon which this **Agreement** is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request that additional eligible projects/items be approved by STATE for **Agreement** funding. Dear Mark:

Late Sunday evening on August 18, my wife Jean Waggoner became very worried about my condition, and phoned 911 for emergency medical response. I had been sick all day with constant intestinal problems and was weak, delirious, and exhausted. Your crew arrived before Jean got off the phone with the dispatcher, and when I saw Bob Clark and Greg Minor come through the door, I knew that I was in good hands.

Your crew immediately connected me to the appropriate monitors, and started hydrating me. They quickly got me down the steps out of the house, unto a gurney, into the ambulance, and on my way to the Emergency Room at Eisenhower. Colin Howe was the ambulance driver, and Greg Minor was the attendant in the ambulance. Besides Bob Clark, Greg Minor, and Colin Howe, there were one or more other IFPD crewmembers that I could not recognize in my delirious state.

The Emergency Room staff at Eisenhower quickly determined that I was dehydrated, and that I probably had an intestinal infection that may have been worsened by the Lyme disease that I had been fighting. I was released from the Emergency Room early in the morning of Monday, August 19, and was back home by noon.
